Council News

The latest minutes from Leader Town council

February 18, 2025

The regular meeting of Council was held on February 18th with Deputy Mayor Dustin Heatcoat, Councillors Riley Feiffer, Dustin Bischoff, Craig Tondevold, Isabelle Blohm and John-Mark Bredeson, and Administrator Erin Romanuik.

The meeting was called to order at 6:58 pm, the agenda was approved, and the minutes of the January 21 regular meeting, January 28, February 6 & 12 General Government committee meetings, February 5 Recreation/Culture committee meeting, and February 6 Utilities committee meeting approved as presented.

The Administrator's request to hire a summer student was approved.

Council moved to a closed session at 7:10 pm to discuss matters pertaining to human resources. Council re-convened to regular session at 7:20 pm.

It was moved that Mathew Stringer be hired as the new Town Foreman and his rate of pay shall be in accordance with the Collective Bargaining Agreement. Acting Foreman, Trevor Dumont, shall continue to receive Foreman pay during the six month probationary period.

Council has awarded the street paving and resurfacing contract for 2025 to Covenant Construction for the quoted price of \$6.09 per square foot.

Councillor Bischoff declared a pecuniary interest in regards to agenda item 6.6: Award Sidewalk RFQ and exited the Council Chambers at 7:33 pm

The 2025 sidewalk contract was awarded to DB Carpentry for the quoted price of \$12.50 per square foot (sidewalk) and \$35.00 per linear foot (curbs).

Councillor Bischoff re-entered the Council Chambers at 7:35 pm.

It was moved that the Mayor send a letter to the Minister of Government Relations to address rural housing concerns and to request a meeting at the upcoming SUMA Convention.

The Administrator's Report was accepted as presented, the financial report was reviewed and filed, capital and general accounts are to be paid and correspondence was read.

Deputy Mayor Heatcoat adjourned the meeting at 8:29 pm.

March 2025

The regular meeting of Council was held on March 4th with Mayor Aaron Wenzel, Councillors Dustin Heatcoat, Riley Feiffer, Dustin Bischoff, Craig Tondevold, Isabelle Blohm and John-Mark Bredeson, and Administrator Erin Romanuik.

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 pm, the agenda was approved, and the minutes of the February 18 regular meeting were approved as presented.

Ms. Kayla Guckert entered the Council Chambers at 7:09 pm to present Leader Minor Hockey's plan to submit a bid to host Hockey Day in Saskatchewan in 2026 and the benefits to the G3 Iceplex for hosting this event. Ms. Guckert exited the Chambers at 7:25 pm.

It was motioned to support the Sandhills Music Festival with a \$100 sponsorship for their 2025 event.

Council moved to a closed session at 7:34 pm to discuss matters pertaining to Economic Development and Planning. Council re-convened to regular session at 7:48 pm.

The Administrator's Report was accepted as presented, the financial report was reviewed and filed, capital and general accounts are to be paid and correspondence was read and filed.

Mayor Wenzel adjourned the meeting at 8:48 pm.



TOWN OF LEADER BYLAW NO. 01-20

A Bylaw of the Town of Leader to Regulate and Control the ownership of animals within the Town of Leader.

LICENSING

Every owner of a dog or cat six (6) months old or older shall register and obtain a Town issued license on or before *January 31*st in each year, or immediately after the date of possession

FINES

Failure to obtain a license for dog/cat:

1st Offence \$50.00

2nd Offence \$100.00

3rd Offence & All Subsequent \$250.00



Please register your pets as soon as possible to avoid being charged with a bylaw violation.
