TOWN OF LEADER NEWS BULLETIN - October 2025

In an attempt to address housing and rental housing needs within the Town of Leader, Council has created a Housing Incentive Policy. This policy offers incentives to anyone building single residential housing or multi-unit housing. Below is a summary of the policy and the incentives offered.

Single Residential Housing Incentive: Eligible projects under this intake stream are new builds, ready-to-move homes, secondary suites (modified incentive package) and relocated used homes (subject to Council approval). Housing renovations/additions, garages, decks and other improvements are all ineligible projects.

Multi-Unit Housing Incentive: Eligible projects under this intake stream are duplexes, fourplexes, fiveplexes, other new multi-housing units (subject to Council approval) and single residential housing converted to duplex (modified incentive package). Renovations/additions to existing multi-unit housing and the addition of rooms to an existing residential dwelling are all ineligible projects.

Incentive Package: The following incentive package is for both Single and Multi-unit projects:

- New water and sewer service lines from the mains to the property line;
- New asphalt paving within one year after a new utility service line is installed;
- New sidewalk along the front of the property, if current sidewalk is below fair condition or has been removed during construction and line installation;
- A capital grant
- A property tax abatement

Capital Grant: The capital grant is a lump sum payment provided to the property owner upon substantial completion of the approved project. Eligible projects shall receive a grant of 1% of the Assessed Value of the property as determined by SAMA once they have completed their assessment after substantial completion. The modified capital grant will be 1% on 50% of the new Assessed Value of the property as determined by SAMA's assessment after substantial completion.

Property Tax Abatement: A property tax abatement is to be applied as of January 1st of the year immediately following substantial completion and only applies to the municipal portion of property taxes. The tiered abatement is as follows:

Year 1: 100% Modified Tax Abatement: Year 1: 75%Year 2: 80% Year 2: 50%

• Year 3: 60% Year 3: 25%

Year 4: 50%

Year 5: 50%

Council News

The latest minutes from Leader Town council

August 19, 2025

The regular meeting of Council was held on August 19th with Mayor Aaron Wenzel, Councillors Dustin Heatcoat, Riley Feiffer, Dustin Bischoff, Craig Tondevold, Isabelle Blohm and John-Mark Bredeson, and Administrator Erin Romanuik.

The meeting was called to order at 6:59 pm, the agenda was approved, and the minutes of the August 5 regular meeting and the August 14 Transportation meeting were approved as presented.

Council awarded the tender for test drilling water wells to Andrews and Sons Drilling. The total services from Andrews and Sons and Beckie Hydrogeologists shall not exceed \$146,000.00.

The installation of additional electrical receptacles at the Millennium Gardens was tabled until further clarification is received on the submitted quote.

It was moved to accept the list of land in arrears as presented by the Administrator and that any land which has half or less than half of the 2024 arrears owing be removed from said list.

Council approved the purchase of an irrigation system at the Leader Cemetery for the quoted price of \$4,178.00.

Council convened to a closed session at 7:45 pm to discuss matters in regards to Human Resources. They reconvened to regular session at 7:52 pm.

The Administrators Report was accepted, the Financial Report was accepted as presented, capital and general accounts are to be paid and the correspondence was read.

Bylaw No. 03/25 being a bylaw of the Town of Leader to regulate the keeping of chickens in an urban area was motioned to be given a third reading. The motion was not seconded and therefore declared lost.

Mayor Wenzel adjourned the meeting at 8:36 pm.

September 2, 2025

The regular meeting of Council was held on September 2nd with Mayor Aaron Wenzel, Councillors Dustin Heatcoat, Riley Feiffer, Dustin Bischoff, Craig Tondevold, Isabelle Blohm (via Zoom) and John-Mark Bredeson, and Administrator Frin Romanuik.

The meeting was called to order at 6:57 pm, the agenda was approved, and the minutes of the August 19 regular meeting were approved as presented.

Council adopted a Soil Compaction Policy prepared by ASI Engineering and shall be implemented by the Town and any contractor doing excavating under roadways.

It was moved to support the RM of Clinworth in their application to receive TSS funding for the preparation and execution of a Phase II Environmental Site Assessment of the former Lemsford Regional Park.

Council declared they are in support of the Town of Leader applying for funding under the Canadian Housing Infrastructure Fund for the Waterline Renewal Project.

Agenda item 6.5—Golf Course Donation has been tabled and will be discussed at the Sept. 19 regular meeting of council.

The Administrator Report was accepted, the Financial Report was accepted as presented, capital and general accounts are to be paid and the correspondence was read

Mayor Wenzel adjourned the meeting at 8:54pm.
