The Town of Leader has received the completed **Water Main Renewal Plan** developed by ASI Engineering.

This initiative cost \$19,500. It is a valuable tool for the Town to utilize for the planned replacement of water mains. In addition, this Plan will form part of the Town's application for funding under the Canadian Housing Infrastructure Fund. If successful, the cost of the water main renewal will be covered at a rate of 73.33% by federal and provincial government and the remaining 26.67% is funded by the Town through tax dollars, fees, and other potential grants.

Council will be hosting a Town Hall in the future to discuss the renewal plan with the ratepayers of Leader. This meeting will be scheduled once the Town is notified by the CHIF grant program about the success of their application.

Between 2019 and 2025, the Town experienced **76 water main breaks**.


55% of the water system is rated **Poor** or **Very Poor**.

Ductile iron and asbestos cement make up 32% of the system and are at beyond service life.

Council News

The latest minutes from Leader Town council

September 16, 2025

The regular meeting of Council was held on September 16th with Mayor Aaron Wenzel, Councillors Dustin Heatcoat, Dustin Bischoff, Craig Tondevold, Isabelle Blohm and John-Mark Bredeson, and Administrator Erin Romanuik.

The meeting was called to order at 6:56 pm, the agenda was approved, and the minutes of the September 2 regular meeting were approved as presented.

Council reviewed and adopted the Housing Incentive Policy and Housing Reserve Fund Policy, which can be reviewed on the Town's website.

It was moved that the Town support the River Ridge Golf Course clubhouse construction with a donation of \$25,000, payable in annual installments of \$5,000.

The Administrator was authorized to issue a RFP for the replacement of the Town Office Complex roof.

The October 7th regular Council meeting was cancelled and therefore only one meeting will be held in October.

Administration was approved to purchase a new copier from Success Office Systems for the quoted price of \$6,950 and that the current copier to be moved to the Leader Library to replace their aging copier.

Council considered a request from the Ministry of Sask. Builds and Procurement for the transfer of ownership of the sewer line servicing the Department of Highways shop. Council determined it would be best to meet with the property owners of the south industrial park to discuss future needs of sewer services in that area.

The painting of a crosswalk between the Sandhills Credit Union and IG Wealth Management buildings in recognition of our veteran was approved. This project is spearheaded by Jackie Mertin and Pam Sifert with the Leader Composite School high school art class completing the work.

The Administrators Report was accepted and the capital and general accounts are to be paid.

Mayor Wenzel adjourned the meeting at 8:36 pm.




